Application was made by me on behalf of the School of Music in June for three visiting professorships under the program named above for the coming academic year. I received a telephone call yesterday from the office of the Vice-Provost for Minority Affairs confirming that to this date, one of the visiting professorships - Composer Adolphus Hailstork - has been approved. This memorandum is to alert your office of this information so that such publicity as can be generated from your office of this event can be initiated. Professor Hailstork will be in residence from September 26 - October 2, 1987. The activities in which he will be involved while here will include the following:
