BLACK FACULTY AND STAFF

SUMMARY OF 12:00 MEETING WITH WHITE FACULTY, STAFF AND PERSONNEL

1. Obstacles which have served to prevent negotiations were spelled out.
  2. It was pointed out that BAM has never had a clear response around which negotiations could occur. This being due to confusing documents from the president and some vice presidents regarding the interpretations of the regents response to BAM demands.
  3. Suggestions were given to white faculty and staff as to what they could do to support BAM, e.g., Adopt SACUA resolutions, Departments plan with Black and not for Blacks, Black representation on all decision making bodies, start a national alumni drive to raise additional funds to meet BAM demands.
  4. We collected approximately \$300.00 for the BAM Strike Fund.
  5. Other issues addressed were: Racism at the U of M and Black Studies program.
  6. Supporters for BAM were acknowledged.
  7. There was a question and answer period.
